PERSEVERANCE OF THE SAINTS

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LOGICAL FALLACY: AFFIRMING THE CONSEQUENT

- A formal logical fallacy confusing the directionality of if-then propositions.
 - If it is raining then the lawn is wet.
 - 'it is raining' (Antecedent)
 - 'lawn is wet' (Consequent)
 - It is raining therefore the lawn is wet. (Affirming the Antecedent) (Correct or Wrong?)
 - Correct
 - It is not raining therefore the lawn is not wet. (Denying the Antecedent) (Correct or Wrong?)
 - Wrong
 - The lawn is not wet therefore it is not raining. (Denying the Consequent) (Correct or Wrong?)
 - Correct
 - The lawn is wet therefore it is raining. (Affirming the Consequent) (Correct or Wrong?)
 - Wrong



AFFIRMING THE CONSEQUENT EXAMPLE 1

- If there was a common ancestor then DNA would be similar between living organisms.
- DNA is similar between living organisms therefore there is a common ancestor.
 (Correct or Wrong?)
- Wrong
- If there was a common designer then DNA would be similar between living organisms.



AFFIRMING THE CONSEQUENT EXAMPLE 2

- If man believes God from his own libertarian free will then the Bible would tell man to believe.
- The Bible tells man to believe therefore man believes from his own libertarian free will.(Correct or wrong?)
- Wrong
- If the Bible is the means by which God calls His regenerated elect then the Bible would tell man to believe.



AFFIRMING THE CONSEQUENT EXAMPLE 3

- If a saved person could lose their salvation then the Bible would warn men to not fall away.
- The Bible warns men to not fall away therefore a saved person could lose their salvation.(Correct or wrong?)
- Wrong
- If the Bible is the means by which God perseveres His regenerated elect then the Bible would warn men to not fall away.
